DETROIT -- The Detroit NAACP is once again pleased to announce plans for 58th Annual Fight for Freedom Fund Dinner. As you know, this is one of the significant iconic events here in the city of Detroit and throughout this region. There is no other event like this in our state or our nation. It is more than a dinner. It is an assembly of a diversity of races, professions, city, suburban, and rural – from the grassroots to corporate America. We seek to bring together - once a year - a grand networking of people who might not otherwise ever encounter each other during their day-to-day work.

The Fight for Freedom Fund Dinner provides an opportunity to bring people together over diverse issues that may ultimately lead to developing a common agenda. Our agenda is always freedom, justice and equal opportunity for all. The theme of this year's dinner is "Freedom Must Never Be Defaulted, It Must Forever Be Exalted!"

This is directly in line with the Dream of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. over 50 years ago which committed itself to never defaulting on the issue of freedom. Even though, after coming to the city of Detroit in June 1963 and then delivering his second speech in Washington, DC in August of 1963, he said that the check had been issued in the bank of freedom and it came back marked *insufficient funds*.
